**If you've been dreaming of a career as a commercial pilot, our Diploma of Aviation (Commercial Pilot Licence – Aeroplane) course is for you.**

This course is a great way to begin your aviation career. Within 85 weeks you'll go from being an aviation novice to a commercial pilot. The course is designed to provide you with all technical and nontechnical skills you will need to achieve your Commercial Pilot Licence with the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA).

Commercial pilots may fly for hire or reward and are authorised to act as pilot in command for aircraft only requiring one pilot, or as co-pilot for aircraft requiring two pilots.

The diploma qualification, together with the CPL, provide you with the qualifications, skills, knowledge and experience to operate as a commercial pilot and to seek initial employment in various roles.

## Course Overview

This is an integrated training course that combines ground theory with practical flight training.

It is designed to be complete in 85 weeks, comprising 20 hours face-to-face learning per week, full time. The course is delivered in 4 modules with the theory and practical training conducted in parallel. This course encompasses a total 170 hours of flying and 1660 hours of course work. All practical units of this course are delivered one-to-one at our campus located at on Camden Airport in Sydney's Macarthur region. Below is a general timeline of the course.

Phase	Weeks	Milestone
1	1 – 12	First Solo
2	13 – 20	Recreational Pilot Licence
3	21 – 35	PPL Assessment
4	36 – 85	Commercial Pilot Licence

### PHASE 1 First Solo

In this module you will learn the essential flying skills required to achieve solo flight. To maintain a measure of ground and flight integration, you must pass theory examinations to progress through this module.

### PHASE 2 Recreational Pilot Licence

In this module you will achieve your Recreational Pilot Licence (also known as an RPL). To maintain a measure of ground and flight integration, you must pass theory examinations to progress through this module.

In addition to flying, this module consists of classroom-based theory lessons, flight briefings and self-study.

- First Area solo exam (Written examination 70% pass)
- CASA Recreational Pilot Licence Flight Test
- AEL Aviation English language proficiency

### PHASE 3 Private Pilot Licence (Assessment)

In this module you will learn to both fly and navigate to the standard of a Private Pilot Licence (also known as a PPL). To maintain a measure of ground and flight integration, you must pass theory examinations to progress through this module.

In addition to flying, this module consists of classroom-based theory lessons, flight briefings and self-study.

- CNAV CPL- Navigation (Written examination 70% pass)
- CMET CPL- Meteorology (Written examination 70% pass)
- CHUF CPL- Human Factors (Written examination 70% pass)





#### **PHASE 4** Commercial Pilot Licence and Advanced Training

In the final module of training you will hone your skills and learn advanced flying skills. On successful completion of this module you will achieve your Commercial Pilot Licence (CPL). To maintain a measure of ground and flight integration, you must pass theory examinations to progress this module.

During this period the student will attend a classrooms, briefings and self-study sessions.

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## Entry Requirements

To be selected for a place in this course, you will need to:

- Have a Year 12 / senior-secondary school certificate;
- Student must be 17 years of age at enrolment, and 18 years old to undertake a flight test
- Attend a pre-screening interview to assess suitability and commitment
- Hold a current Class 1 Medical. Altocap can help you through this process.
- Hold an Aviation Reference Number (ARN).
- Hold a valid Aviation Security Identification Card (ASIC)
- English Language Proficiency. Meet the minimum requirements for English Language proficiency as set out by CASA.
- For international learners, evidence of satisfactory Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) proficiency.

An application for Recognition of Qualification, Prior Learning and Current Competencies may be made by candidates with previous aeronautical experience.
